#### A First Course in Elementary Differential Equations

The graph of a particular solution is called a solution curve The function  $y(t) = Ce^{-3t} + 2t + 1$  is the general solution to the differential equation  $y'' + 3y = 6t + 5$  (See Problem 120) A family of solution curves is shown in Figure 11 Notice for  $C \neq 0$  the solution cruves have an oblique asymptote with equation  $y(t) = 2t + 1$  Figure 11
